So what are we doing?

AECS sells advanced test and service equipment to workshops throughout NZ (and AU). We prepare the equipment before we send/deliver, install and test. We take our time to train the technicians on how to use the equipment most efficiently. We travel throughout the country for some equipment installations and training. We also travel for annual service and calibrations.

We provide expert support on the equipment we distribute, until long after the sale has been made. The AECS equipment support ranges from updating the tools, to a 'refresh training' staff in the workshops, onsite or remotely. We support Car, Truck, Bus, Heavy equipment and Electric Vehicle technicians in their workshops.

A very important aspect of our work is to Motivate Technicians. Our industry cannot afford to lose personnel.



So what could you be doing?

After a period of inhouse training you will be asked to assist and later independently, prepare equipment for delivery. You will be asked to participate in the calibration and servicing nationwide. When all goes well you will be trained to deliver FCT (First Contact Training), which is to teach the technicians the finer detail of our equipment. If you reach a high level of confidence with the tools, you will be asked to support the technicians on an ongoing basis. When you are on the top of your game and actually enjoy what you do, you will be asked to communicate with workshop technicians and guide them to the best equipment solution for their workshop environment (sales). AECS' ethics mean that we are not after the highest sales value, we rely on ongoing support from each and every workshop out there.

If you gain the right skills, there is also the possibility to grow into a diagnostic trainer's role.

What can we do for you?

The position is preferably full time, however we have the option of for example 9 day fortnights, or 4.5day weeks.
